

Rights and Freedoms

In this assignment, you will consider the "Drugs in the Backpack" scenario on the [Try Judging website](#). Examine the many **legal rights** guaranteed under the [Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms](#). Read these rights, and then pick four of them to apply to the given scenario of the discovery of drugs in Devin's backpack. For our purposes, we will consider each sub-item to be a different right. For example, 11a is a different right than 11b.

For each of the **four (4)** legal rights, provide the following information either in paragraph or table form:

1. Identify and summarize the right. (1 mark for each right)
2. Describe how the right applies to this scenario. (2 marks for each right)
3. Describe a worst case scenario for what could have happened without the protection of the legal right. Think of the worst case scenario. (2 marks for each right)

Complete this assignment in a new Microsoft Word document.

An example is provided below. You cannot use this same legal right as one of the four that you choose.

Specific Right or Freedom (copied from Charter; include the number)	How It Applies	What Could Have Happened Without It
8. Everyone has the right to be secure against unreasonable search or seizure.	Devin's bag was only searched when he offered it at the checkpoint. He gave consent to have it searched.	Anybody waiting in line, such as Devin's friend who was holding his backpack, or anybody just passing by on the street could be searched by police without any reason and have their belongings confiscated.
